**General John P. Jumper (U.S. Air Force, Retired)**  
**17<sup>th</sup> Chief of Staff, United States Air Force**

John Jumper is currently the Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer of the Museum of the American Revolution in Philadelphia, PA, a new museum built to sustain the values of our Nation's founding. He joined the private sector in September 2005 following an extraordinary 39-year military career, including serving as the 17<sup>th</sup> Chief of Staff of the United States Air Force leading more than 700,000 men and women through the Global War on Terrorism. He administered annual budgets of more than \$100 billion and oversaw the delivery of numerous air and space combat and support systems, from the F-22 fighter to the Predator and Global Hawk unmanned systems. As a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, he provided military advice directly to the President of the United States, the Secretary of Defense and the National Security Council.



Prior to his position as Chief of Staff, General Jumper served as a wartime commander during conflicts in Iraq, Serbia and Kosovo. He also served as Senior Military Assistant to Secretary of Defense Dick Cheney and Secretary Les Aspin. He has accumulated 5000 flying hours that includes more than 1400 combat hours in Vietnam and Iraq.

More recently John served as the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of SAIC, then an \$11B public company. During his tenure he led a transformational separation of the company and continued as Chairman and CEO of the new public company, Leidos, until his retirement in 2014. For his alma mater VMI, John served on its Foundation Board of Trustees and on the Governor-appointed VMI Board of Visitors, culminating in his being elected its President (his two 4-year terms on the BoV concluded in June 2017). John was recently selected to receive VMI's highest honor: the New Market Medal, a prestigious award rarely bestowed – he is only the 15<sup>th</sup> recipient of the New Market Medal since its inception in 1962, and, with his selection, seven of the 15 New Market Medal recipients have also received the Medallion of Honor from the Virginians of Maryland.



John continues to serve on the board of Leidos as well as the boards of Hyster-Yale, North American Coal, Hamilton Beach Brands and is Lead Director of Rolls-Royce North America. He and his wife, Ellen, live in Spotsylvania, Virginia. They have three daughters, Catherine, Janet and Melissa who all served in the Air Force.
